- ❖ Lifelong Naperville resident and product of school district 203 (NCHS). Grew up working in the family construction business after school and continued full-time while attending college.

They took the company public on NASDAQ in 2013 and merged with another NASDAQ traded peer in 2017 where Scott continues to serve as a bank board member. Now, with \$13 billion dollars in assets, the company was recently ranked 26th overall (#1 in Illinois) on Forbes' list of America's Best Banks.

- ❖ Scott is Chairman of the Board of Trustees at Marmion Academy in Aurora and is an 18-year member of the North Central College Board of Trustees (his alma mater).
- ❖ He has served the last 20 years on the Naperville Development Partnership (economic development) board including two years as Chairman.
- ❖ Scott is married to Lynda (25 years), a local real estate broker. They have two children: Sam, a 2022 United States Military Academy West Point graduate who is now serving as a Second Lieutenant in the US Army 82nd Airborne and Hope, a varsity volleyball student-athlete at Rhodes College in Memphis, Tennessee.
